

Local ORV park back on track

Interest is 'enormous' for 13-acre facility under construction, set to open in September

Groveland Twp. — While delayed by the pandemic, things are moving again at the future site of the Holly Oaks ORV Park, which was supposed to open in June. Opening is now slated for September.

At 10:20 a.m., Wednesday July 1, a driver with the Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC) made possibly the 10th trip of the day dropping off three yards of plant-rich soil near the park entrance. This material is used to slow down erosion of manmade trails at the former gravel mine.

This park will be operated by the Oakland County Parks and Recreation Commission (OCPR) under a use agreement with the Michigan

Department of Natural Resources (DNR), which owns the site.

Dan Stencil, executive officer of OCPR, thinks the interest in the park to off-road enthusiasts will be "enormous." Getting it this far required collaboration between the DNR, OCPR and Groveland and Holly townships.

"If we did not have the relationships between all groups, this project would not have happened," said Jason Fleming with the DNR.

The LAFF (Linden, Argentine Township, Fenton Township, Fenton City) Pathway group has been working for years on developing non-motorized pathways in local communities.

The city of Fenton was asking for support as the Act 51 agency, meaning the city will act as the fiscal agent and take the lead on the project, along with the LAFF Pathway group.

It would be a 10-foot wide bituminous (asphalt) paved pathway with a minimum of 2 feet clearance on either side, or a 14-feet wide reinforced boardwalk with all improvements meeting state requirements.

The four municipalities, along with Southern Lakes Parks and Recreation (SLPR), have allocated \$15,000 to the project for matching funds, and LAFF Pathways have allocated \$48,000.

The project has received approximately \$441,509 from the Gen-

esee County Metropolitan Planning Commission to be received in 2023.

The grant only partially funds the project. So far, approximately \$1,002,000 has been raised in private funding and additional grants. If approved, the MDOT grant would provide an additional \$997,000 to fund the project in 2023.

If all the grants they plan to apply for come in, they will need to raise approximately \$600,000 in private funds and donations.

The Silver Lake Road Connector Trail has been identified as a Tier 1 Short Term Priority in the Genesee County Regional Non-Motorized long range transportation plan. Tier 1 projects are identified as having strong southern support and are the highest priority for development.

Krug mentioned the millage vote that failed in Fenton, Fenton Township and Linden that would have raised taxes to develop nonmotorized pathways. The taxpayers voted no on it, he said.

Stencil describes the park as a "50year dream." More recently it started taking shape with test events staring in 2014. "We are trying to create a park that will have attributes that will be of interest for (owners of) four-wheel drive vehicles, side-by-sides and motorcycles," he said.

The park will eventually be 235 acres. There are 113 acres in development now, while the remaining gravel mining operations finish in the rest of the property. This will be the first motorized park in the OCPR portfolio.

The DNR owns other ORV parks like the Silver Lake Sand Dunes, St. Helen Motorsports Scramble Area and the Black Mountain Scramble area.

By opening day, multiple trails, obstacles, hill climbs, descents, rock courses, trails around lakes, and a sand course will be built. These have been designed and created through contractors and volunteer advisory groups like Friends of Holly Oaks ORV Park. They've built trails for stock vehicles as well, in conjunction with auto manufacturers.

"When you look at ORV ownership, southeast Michigan is kind of a hot bed," said Tom Zielinski, who organizes ORV events all over the country as president of Z Performance Group out of Auburn Hills. He assists this park with marketing and designing trails.

He believes that interest in ORVs is increasing. In his business he's familiar with national sales data for power sports dealers. Sales are up right now instead of down.

"Outdoor adventure lifestyle has been huge, and continues to grow, and has grown more with the pandemic," he said.

Prior public events have drawn thousands of people and according to the DNR, there were more than 200,000 ORVs registered in Michigan in 2014.

The park is set to open Sept. 17, at an approximate cost of \$15 per vehicle. An ORV and trail license will be required, but not a county park sticker.

in person at their assigned polling station or vote by absentee voter ballot. Absentee voter ballots are available to all registered voters through their local clerk. Your request for an absent voter ballot must be in writing.

Requests to have an absent voter ballot mailed to you must be received by your clerk no later than 5 p.m. the Friday before the election. If you're already registered at your current address, you can request an absent voter ballot in person at your clerk's office anytime up to 4 p.m. on the day prior to the election. If you're registering to vote or updating your address by appearing at your clerk's office on Election Day, you can request an absent voter ballot at the same time you register. If you request your AV ballot the day before the election or on Election Day, you must vote the ballot in the clerk's office.

Fenton

Fenton City Clerk Sue Walsh said they are working on their plan. "There will be measures in place to protect the election worker and voter such as; masks, face shields, gloves and social distancing," she said. "I expect wait time and lines to be long at the polls. Social distancing will only allow a minimal number of voters in the precincts at one time.

"I expect voter turnout to be unprecedented for a State Primary Election."

Absentee ballots will make up the majority of voters. "In my opinion, voting absentee ballot is the fastest and safest way to vote," she said.

Argentine Township

Argentine Township Clerk Denise Graves said voters can expect to vote in person in August with COVID-19 safeguards in place. "They may have to wait in lines outside of the building and enter a few at a time to maintain social distancing," Graves said.

Election workers will wipe down surfaces often and follow the guidelines for COVID-19 from the Bureau of Elections. Voters will be asked to wear a face covering to protect election workers.

Graves said she submitted an order for a new ballot drop box from the state by the November election, but she hopes to get it sooner. This will be specifically for election ballots. Voters can register to vote online and can request an absent ballot application online.

"I strongly encourage voters to vote by absentee ballot," she said. "This will give them time to research their candidate or party and carefully make their choices at home. Absentee voting is easy if a voter reads the simple instructions.

"Our voters need to know that absentee voting is safe. If a voter returns their ballot to the ballot drop box at the township hall instead of mailing it, they can be sure their vote will count.

"The most important thing is to sign the outside of their ballot on the signature line. If the ballot is not signed, it will not count."

Argentine Township has 4,989 registered voters as of Tuesday, June 30. Registrations are expected to increase by a few hundred as we approach a presidential election date.

Argentine Township has close to 1,200 absent ballot requests at this time, which is about 25 percent of its voters. Graves said most have requested to be on a permanent absent voter list, which will reduce the voters who vote at the polls in the future elections.

"I estimate that our turnout could be 30 percent," she said. "The number of registered voters have remained steady for the past five years."

Fenton Township

Thomas Broecker, operations manager/deputy clerk of Fenton Township, said he's been training election workers with in-person sessions as well as Zoom remote sessions. The township is still developing its best practice for the August election.

He said with the township using the Lake Fenton High School gym, they do have plenty of room to spread out voting tables. They bought a clear plastic barrier that is sturdy, but lightweight and can be rolled up for storage, to separate election workers from voters. Volunteers will be constantly wiping surfaces and pencils to safeguard everyone.

Broecker said absentee voter ballot requests this election are "through the roof." He too encourages residents to vote absentee because of the coronavirus. Typically, there are 1,200 absentee voter ballots, but this election, Broecker said he's received four times that amount.

"We'll do everything we can so that people feel safe," Broecker said.
