Local family now has 10 Eagle Scouts

■ Most recent is one of first females in Michigan, one of first females in U.S. to earn highest rank

Breanna Trecha, 19, of Fenton Troop 212G, comes from a long line of Eagle Scouts in her family. She will become the 10th person in her family to have earned the highest rank in Scouting, the Eagle Scout Rank. She also becomes one of the first female Eagle Scouts in the U.S., since females were eligible starting Oct 1.

Breanna, of the Michigan Crossroads Council, has been involved in Scouting since turning 14, joining the local Venture Scouts troop. There she became involved in the National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) program. This program takes Scouts in a week-long program to learn leadership skills that they will take back to their troops and then use throughout their lives.

"My brothers all went through the NYLT program," Breanna said. "They came back from the camp all excited about it. That's when I decided to sign up."

She spent three years with the NYLT program. First as a participant, then working on staff and then in 2019 becoming the Senior Patrol Leader (SPL) to lead the program.

Her family has been actively involved in Scouting. Both her grandfathers were Boy Scouts and it was there that Breanna's father, Jeff Trecha, an Eagle Scout (1976) himself, would also grow up in the Scouting program.

"I knew it was a great program where boys could learn so many skills like camping, first aid, swimming that

then could be used into adulthood," Jeff Trecha said. "I was so glad to see the Scouts open up the program to girls where they too could experience so many adventures."

Besides her father earning the Eagle Rank, Breanna has three Eagle Scout brothers. John earned his Eagle in 2012, Parker 2014 and her twin brother, Bradley in 2016. Breanna has four uncles (all her dad's brothers) who have earned the highest rank as well as her cousin Alex in 2010.

"I always grew up in Scouting," Breanna said. "I started in Girl Scouts as my mother (Amy) was the leader and I spent six years in that program. My dad was a den leader for two of my brothers in Cub Scouts and I was always able to go along with the Cub Scouts as well."

When John joined the Boy Scouts their dad, Jeff, became one of the leaders immediately and then spent three years as their Scoutmaster.

Breanna had the opportunity in 2019 to attend the World Scout Jamboree at the Summit Bechtel National Scout Reserve in West Virginia. Over 50,000 Scouts from 167 countries participated in the jamboree.

If Breanna wasn't camping with the troop, the weekends would be spent camping with her dad and learning all the skills needed to earn the ranks.

"Last summer we barely would see Breanna," Amy Trecha said.

Besides earning her ranks, Breanna also earned merit badges. The Scouts offer 137 merit badges that range from astronomy to wood working. Merit badges offer the Scouts the opportunity to explore hobbies, skills, interests in just about every aspect that one can

imagine. In order to earn the Eagle rank, Scouts must earn 21 merit badges, 13 of which are required and every Scout must earn. Breanna not only earned the 21 merit badges necessary to earn her Eagle, but earned 51.

Her three brothers each have earned all the merit badges available to earn (a

feat that only about 300 Scouts in the whole 110-year history of Scouting have ever earned).

The most challenging for Breanna was Scuba Diving. "I was able to earn my scuba certification so now I can go scuba diving any time," she said.

Breanna joined Troop 212G in March 2019. With so much Scouting experience, she became the SPL for her troop. "I

wanted the Scouts (girls) to get as much out of Scouting as possible. I also have a great Scoutmaster, Mrs. Staley."

All Eagle Scouts must perform and lead an Eagle Scout project.

"I wanted to help beautify the area so I led a group of volunteers in refurbishing, repairing and staining about 50 park picnic tables that had never been repaired. We spent over 100

hours fundraising, getting materials, supplies and then actually completing the project," she said.

Breanna plans to earn a Bachelor's of Science majoring in Biology, a minor in Chemistry and a Master's degree in Pharmaceutical Research at Toledo where she hopes to be able to look at ways the pharmaceutical industry can assist in curing diseases.

Wax Coke Bottles

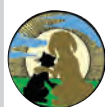
The novelty factor of these is great, the first time you get one. Then the realization sets in: you're biting through wax to get not even a mouthful of sugar water.

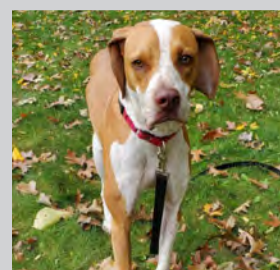
