Township joins river trail coalition

■ Shiawassee River Water Trail Coalition helps maintain health of river, launch sites and more

The Fenton Township Board of Trustees unanimously voted to join the Shiawassee River Water Trail Coalition (SRWTC) during a virtual meeting Monday, Feb. 15.

David Lossing, chair of the SRWTC, gave a presentation on the coalition and the different groups that maintain and add to the quality of the Shiawassee River.

Supervisor Vince Lorraine said the coalition is a “great project,” and he wants more people to know about it.

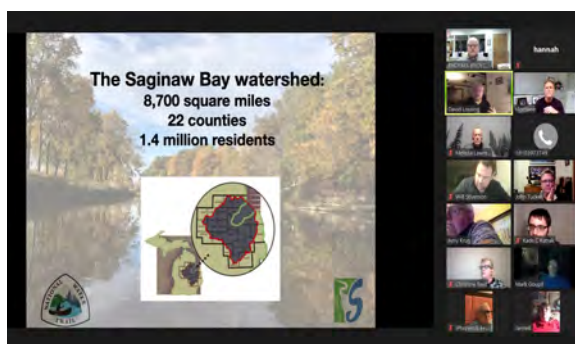
Treasurer John Tucker complimented the river paddles and said these organizations are adding to the usage of the river.

“It’s great to see the participation in that,” he said.

Argentine Township Supervisor Brian Saad welcomed the township to the coalition.

Lossing said during the COVID-19 pandemic, more people are participating in river-related activities.

The Shiawassee River is part of the Saginaw Bay watershed, which runs through 22 counties. The Shiawassee

River is 88 miles and was designated a National Water Trail on Oct. 22, 2020. It’s one of five national water trails in Michigan and 33 in the U.S.

The coalition’s founding groups consist of Headwater Trails Inc., Keepers of the Shiawassee and Friends of the Shiawassee River, which created a memorandum of understanding to state that the SRWTC will be the umbrella organization that coordinates the three non-profits and efforts relating to the river.

These organizations managed three different parts of the trail- the upper, middle and lower areas.

“Now coordinated into one trail system, the public will envision an approachable recreational resource with relative ease and safety,” according to Lossing’s presentation.

The website, shiawasseewatertrail.org, has information on the 14 sites to put in or take out recreational vessels, as well as information on restaurants near these sites and other amenities. It includes the distance of different routes and the level of paddling skill needed.

Lossing discussed past projects and achievements. They’ve secured grants from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and were designated as one of the first eight “State Water Trails” in Michigan.

The Shiawassee River is now part of Terrain360, which is a company that digitally maps water trails. The village of Vernon recently installed the 29th launch site on the river with the first kayak locker. Organizers are working to install mile markers along the river. Holly Township provided funding to the North Oakland Headwaters Land Conservancy to use GIS mapping along the river to place mile markers.

They’ve also partnered with the Conservation Fund, MDNR, and Friends of the Shiawassee River to release 250 sturgeon back into the river, and they received a grant from the Great Lakes Integrated Sciences Assessment (GLISA) to understand the effects of climate change on the Shiawassee River.

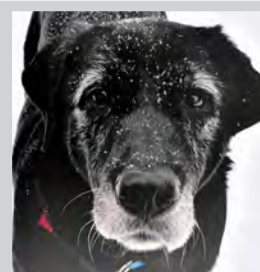

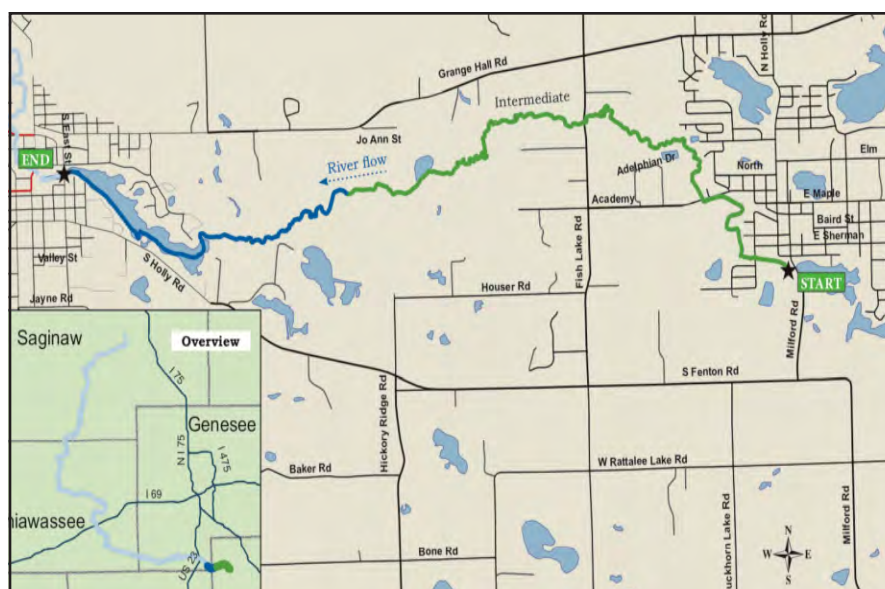

Hyfi is working to install water sensors on bridge decks over the river to monitor the flow and depth. They've also partnered with Fenton Winery and Brewery to create a craft beer and wine named after the river. They raised nearly \$1,500.

The SRWTC has committees on recreation planning, launch sites, stream monitoring, advancement, community engagement, nominations, signage and invasive species.

Goals for the SRWTC include:

- Promote and improve river related recreation
- Public access sites and user experiences
- Inform and educate the public on topics related to river health, safety, and Leave No Trace Principles
- Support local and regional efforts to increase water based recreation and tourism
- Enhance partnerships among water trail landowners and managers
- Preserve and protect river resources for future generations



- Increase connections between communities, public lands, and land trails
- Secure long-term sustainability of the water trail
- Maintain access sites
- Manage woody debris to support fish populations and allow for recreational access with minimal impact

House Bill 4019: Allocate new federal coronavirus relief dollars to schools

To appropriate \$868.5 million in recently approved federal coronavirus relief money, which is about 25 percent of the entire amount available to the state, with the rest to be allocated later. The appropriation directs \$510 million federal dollars to expand food stamp distributions and related programs; \$165.5 million for household rent and utility subsidies; \$143.7 million for coronavirus testing and contact tracing; and smaller amounts for other purposes.

House Bill 4048: Allocate new federal coronavirus relief dollars to schools

To revise school spending in the 2021-22 fiscal year to accommodate a \$1.8 billion increase in federal coronavirus

relief. The bill would allocate \$1.490 billion to school districts, which they can spend on any of 15 specific activities listed in the federal relief bill. Among other items, this bill also authorizes \$86.7 million for non-public schools, \$21 million for extra grants to summer school teachers, and more. The bill also appropriates \$363 million state dollars to pay for extra “incentives” to get teachers back in public school classrooms. The bill is “tie-barred” to House Bill 4049, which transfers the power to close schools during an epidemic from the state health department to local health departments; this means the school spending bill can’t become law unless that bill also becomes law.

House Bill 4049: Transfer power to close schools during epidemic from state health department to locals

To establish that the director of the Department of Health and Human Services does not have the authority to issue epidemic-related emergency orders that close schools for in-person instruction or prohibit school sporting events. The legislature gave this authority to the state health department director in the Public Health Code enacted in 1978; the bill would amend that law by instead giving this authority to local health departments.



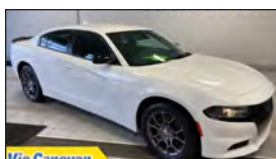
